Trent Dilfer Starts Off Season With a Victory

Deshaun Watson and Stefon Diggs both scored 31.50 points and led a high-powered offensive charge for Trent Dilfer as they took down the Green Bay Gamblers 172.14-156.36 in the first week of SPIFFY league play.

Watson threw for 310 yards, two touchdowns, and an interception in a loss against the Tennessee Titans while Diggs caught nine passes for 128 yards and two touchdowns, including a two-point conversion that tied up the score late in regulation against Green Bay.

As for the rest of the Dilfer lineup, other notable players included other starting QB Jared Goff with 24.36 points and running back Christian McCaffrey with 21.70 points of his own on Sunday. While the offense led the way to victory for Dilfer, the defense did not do much to contribute to the effort.

The Vikings defense only got 6.48 points for Dilfer, which is a big difference compared to the 18.28 points they got in Week 1. Meanwhile, Steelers linebacker T.J. Watt managed to earn only a single point off a single tackle.

“I wouldn’t say it hurt the team a lot because of the strong offensive play this week, but yes he did have a down week” said Dilfer co-manager Samuel Lenz on Watt’s performance. In

comparison, bench linebacker Von Miller had 5.50 points, which will get him the start this upcoming week Lenz says.

“We are looking into options to maybe release Watt and pick up a DB, but we haven’t decided yet” he said.

For the Gamblers, the luck was not so much on their side. While they jumped to a 27.60-point lead after Thursday night courtesy of A.J. Green, his performance hurt their starting defense in the Ravens.

“It was bittersweet, but we’ll take it” said Gamblers manager Michael Knight. “I guess it’s a good thing we won’t have to worry about another match up between these two until mid-November.”

Knight also felt that there could have been more production out of their starting running backs Jay Ajayi and Dalvin Cook. The team took a chance with them starting due to their favorable matchups, but it didn’t pay off.

“There will definitely be changes to our starting RB positions” Knight said. “As for the rest of our squad, we feel pretty solid.”

Trent Dilfer will look to remain undefeated this week against Team 3 while the Gamblers play for their first win of the season against Point hockey.
